A native of Dayton, **Alan Bowman** received his bachelor’s degree in Systems Analysis with a minor in Piano Performance from Miami University (1988, Oxford, Ohio), and a Master of Music degree with a major in Organ Performance from Florida Atlantic University (2005, Boca Raton, Florida). Alan worked in Florida for 25 years as a director of music in Lutheran, Anglican, and Roman Catholic churches.

In 2023 Alan received his diploma from the Royal Carillon School “Jef Denyn” in Mechelen, Belgium and performed concerts in Belgium, The Netherlands, Germany, Ireland and the U.S. He has served as Blanchard Carillon Fellow at Bok Tower Gardens in Lake Wales, Florida (2023/24, 2025) and is a Carillonneur Member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America. Upon the retirement of Larry Weinstein (Deeds Carillon, 1988 to 2023), Alan was appointed Carillonneur at Carillon Historical Park in Dayton and performs the summer concert series at the Mary M. Emery Memorial Carillon in Mariemont.
