DALE PARK SCHOOL SURVEY

The Town Crier will be including a survey in their next issue asking for residents to give their opinions about possible uses for Dale Park School when it is vacated by the school district. One of the considerations had been for the Village to purchase and remodel the building as a community center. Unfortunately, after looking into the expense to convert the building for that purpose, we have realized the cost to our taxpayers would be too high. The building is almost 90 years old and needs extensive updating. It would then need to be reconfigured to serve as a community and activity center. We would need to remove the asbestos and any mold. According to the feasibility study done by CR Architecture and Design, we would need a 6 mil levy to repair, restore and remodel the building. We would then have the cost of operating the center. With utilities, insurance, upkeep and the need to hire a manager, a janitorial service, and a recreation director, we would need to pass a levy to cover the operational costs. It is estimated this would be a 3 mil levy. The two levies would put a total tax burden on citizens of approximately 9 mils. In this economy, we cannot ask residents to assume that debt. There is no doubt in my mind that if we work together, a purpose for Dale Park School will be found and this historic building will be saved. It is, of course, the School Board's decision as to the best buyer for the building, but we will work with the board to find an investor who also wants to save and restore the school building.

WEST STREET PARKING PLAN REVISED



After several meetings attended by Joe Miller, who is the Chairman of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee of Council, Mariemont City Schools, and Spinnenweber Builders, it does not seem feasible for the Village to go through with the West Street parking plan that had been proposed. The cost to the Village would simply be too high at a time when we are trying so hard to keep expenses down. However, we have not given up on adding more parking spaces. Chairman Miller and I are working with the School Board to allow for the lot at the elementary school to be used for public parking *during non-school* hours. When combined with other parking spaces we have already added, the school lot would provide us with approximately 90 parking places to serve the patrons of our businesses around the Village Square.

DETAILED EXPENSES REQUESTED

Included in the packets each Council person receives for the regular Council meetings is a list of bills to be paid. At the Council meeting on April 9th, Council asked for more details on miscellaneous expenses for purchases made from such places Staples, Sam's Club, KOI Auto Parts, Ace Hardware, and Bailey's Hardware. An article in the Eastern Hills Journal on this subject did not give all the facts. These expenses, which are usually listed as miscellaneous parts, supplies, and materials, are made up of purchases that have been by the different departments of the Village. Department heads OK these purchases beforehand and review the receipts before turning them in for payment. They can be for something as small as a few screws to something as large as a vehicle part. The receipts are filed in the Village Office for the State Auditors or anyone else who would like to review them. The way these expenses are listed is nothing new. What is new is the fact that the Fire Department is now doing the bulk of the maintenance at the Municipal Building as well as the majority of the vehicle maintenance and repairs for the Police Department fleet and Fire Department apparatus. This has caused an increase in the amount we pay to hardware and auto parts suppliers, but has drastically reduced the amounts we used to pay for auto and building maintenance and repairs. The office will be giving more details on the list of bills to be paid so Council can see how these small purchases add up, and shows how our very talented and versatile firefighters are saving taxpayers with their willingness to take on these extra tasks.




CERTIFIED INFANT CAR SEAT TECHNICIANS

ATTENTION GOLFERS – KIWANIS CLUB FUNDRAISER GOLF OUTING SCHEDULED


