TOWNHOME GARDEN BEAUTIFICATION CONTEST

For the 6th year, the Village will be sponsoring a Landscaping Beautification Contest for owners and tenants of the Historic Townhome district. Gardens will be judged on the overall appearance of the yard, flower beds, and other landscape features. Contestants can enter either their front yard or back yard or both. Tenants should get the OK from their landlord before planting. Judging will be done by members of the Parks Advisory Board the first or second week of June and the winner will be announced at the June 16th meeting of the Mariemont Civic Association. Prizes include a one-year family membership to the Mariemont Swimming Pool, cookie and crackers 'towers' from Kellogg, as well as gift cards from the National Exemplar Restaurant, 50 West Brewing, Hahana Beach, Mio's, Kroger, and more! IRS SCAM REMINDER

The closer we get to the end of tax season, the more likely you are to receive a phone call or email from someone saying that they represent the IRS. If you are contacted in this way, please be aware that it is a scam. The IRS ONLY contacts citizens in writing through the mail. DO NOT give out any personal information to anyone over the phone or in an email. If someone calls and says they are with the IRS or the Treasury Department, just hang up. If someone sends an email and says they are with the IRS or the Treasury Department, just delete the message. Do not fall for these scams.

USE SIDEWALKS FOR SAFETY

We are very fortunate in Mariemont to be one of the most walkable communities around. Over the past couple of years, we have done a lot to improve our sidewalks and added new ones to make the Village safer. However, we are getting complaints from drivers who say they have often encountered pedestrians using the streets instead of the sidewalks. Often times, people are walking side-by-side, three or four abreast, making it impossible for traffic to get through. If you choose not to use the sidewalks or you are on a street without sidewalks, please be aware of cars trying to get through and move to the side of the road so they can safely pass by. Also, with summer just around the corner, we are asking for drivers to please watch out for our children.





TRASH & OTHER WASTE IN STORM SEWERS

The Service Department was recently called to take care of a storm sewer back up. When they finally got the storm sewer cleared out, they found that the clog had been caused by a plastic bag filled with dog feces. This is totally unacceptable. The storm sewers are not to be used to dispose of waste or garbage of any kind. They are there to carry away rain water and to help prevent the flooding of streets. A storm sewer clogged with trash cannot work as it should. Also, the storm sewers eventually drain out into creeks and rivers, so placing trash or dog feces in them is bad for the environment.

NEW SCHEDULE FOR SERVICE DEPARTMENT BRUSH ROUTE

Effective immediately, the Service Department will be picking up brush on the first and last Monday and Tuesday of each month. They will take any limbs that are 3" in diameter or larger. Anything smaller than that should be broken up and put in a clear plastic or brown paper bag and set out at the curb. Rumpke will pick that yard waste up at no charge on your regular trash collection day. Reducing brush pick up to twice per month will allow the Service Department to water trees and flower beds in the parks and throughout the Village. *REMINDER: Rumpke cannot take yard waste that has been mixed with dirt, rocks, or trash. They are only able to take sticks, plants, bush trimmings, grass clippings, leaves, and other yard waste than can be run through a mulcher. Rocks, bricks, and concrete cannot be taken as they cause damage to the truck's compactor system. Also remember Hamilton County requires that all upholstered furniture, mattresses, and box springs be fully wrapped in plastic for disposal.*

UPCOMING EVENTS

As is our annual tradition, the Memorial Day Parade will start at the Parish Center at 8:30AM and will head east to the Municipal Building for the raising of the flag and lowering it to half mast, reading of the Memorial Day Kiwanis Club Essay Contest winner's message and the presentation of the Outstanding Citizen of the Year. The parade will then turn and go west to the Pioneer Cemetery. It will end with the donut, juice, and coffee sale at the Parish Center. This is an important fundraising event for the Civic Association, so your participation is greatly appreciated.
