Terry Vaughan was a pianist, wartime entertainment director, conductor, composer, and performing arts administrator. He worked first in New Zealand, where he was born, and then moved to Australia in 1955. Among his pieces are two written for the carillon.

Gary White is Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Music at Iowa State University. In 1988 he was presented with the UC Berkeley Medal by the University of California at Berkeley for his carillon compositions.

Willem Vogel was a Dutch composer, mostly for organ and carillon. While I attended the Netherlands Carillon School his music was very popular in both The Netherlands and Belgium.

The lyrics for "John Anderson" are a poem written by Robert Burns.

John Anderson my jo, John, When we were first acquent; Your locks were like the raven, Your bony brow was brent; But now your brow is beld, John, Your locks are like the snaw; But blessings on your frosty pow, John Anderson my Jo.

"O **Gin I** Was Where **Gaudie Rins**", in spite of its snappy rhythm, tells a sad story of a lass who was twice married but never a wife. Both husbands met untimely deaths.

"Suite Seasons" was commissioned by the Thomas Rees Carillon Society to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the Thomas Rees Carillon. It was premiered by Carlo Van Ulft at the Springfield (IL) International Carillon Festival in June of 2021. All the other artists in the festival were asked to play two movements from the Suite. I was a guest that summer and these are the two movements I played.
