

Larry Weinstein was introduced to the carillon while a student at Indiana University. He subsequently enrolled at The Netherlands Carillon School where he earned his final diploma in 1975. He received first prizes in performance competitions in Alkmaar (1974), Goes (1975), and Tiel (1978) and in 1978, was awarded the Prix d'Excellence for carillon performance.

In 1988, he was appointed carillonneur of the 57-bell Deeds Carillon at Carillon Historical Park in Dayton, Ohio. He served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America from 1990-1996 and as its President from 1993-1996. In 1992, he hosted the Guild's national congress in Dayton.

Dr. Weinstein has performed on most of the major instruments in the United States and Europe. These included the House of Parliament (Ottawa), University of Michigan, University of California-Berkeley, University of Chicago, Princeton University, the National Cathedral (Washington, D.C.), the Cathedral of Notre Dame (Antwerp), Vor Frelsers Kirke (Copenhagen), and the Royal Palace, Westertoren, and Olde Kirkstoren (Amsterdam).

Dr. Weinstein received a B.S. in engineering from the University of Cincinnati, M.S. in manufacturing management from GMI, and Ph.D. in operations management from the University of Kentucky. He served as a member of the Board of Examiners for the Baldrige National Quality Award program in 2001, 2002, and 2003 and as a senior examiner and judge for the Ohio Award for Excellence program. He retired as a professor of Supply Chain Management at Wright State University in 2020. He and his wife, Robin, reside in Yellow Springs with their two horses, donkey, multiple cats and dogs, and hundreds of purple martins.
