About our carillonneur...

Alan Bowman was born in Dayton, Ohio. He received his bachelor's degree in Systems Analysis with a minor in Piano Performance from Miami University (1988, Oxford, Ohio), and a Master of Music degree with a major in Organ Performance from Florida Atlantic University (2005, Boca Raton, Florida). Alan lived and worked in Florida for more than 25 years as a director of music in Lutheran, Anglican and Roman Catholic churches.

In 2021 Alan was introduced to the carillon by Larry Weinstein (second Carillonneur of the Deeds Carillon in Dayton) and was encouraged to study at the Royal Carillon School "Jef Denyn" in Belgium. Alan was taught by Koen Van Assche, and upon graduation in June 2023 he performed a 16-concert tour in the U.S., Belgium, The Netherlands, Germany, and Ireland, and for the World Carillon Congress in Utrecht, The Netherlands, in conjunction with the Utrecht Early Music Festival. From October 2023 through February 2024 Alan



was a Carillon Fellow at Bok Tower Gardens in Lake Wales, Florida, under the guidance of Geert D'hollander.

In March 2024, upon Larry Weinstein's retirement, Alan was appointed third Carillonneur of the Deeds Carillon at Carillon Historical Park and is very happy to be playing in Mariemont this summer.
