RESOLUTION NO. 0-10-15

TO AUTHORIZE THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR  
STREET REPAIR AND TO DECLARE EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Service Committee recommends that bids be solicited in order to contract for the repair of specified streets within the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE  
VILLAGE  
OF MARIEMONT, HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO, TWO THIRDS OF  
THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

SECTION I. That the Village of Mariemont approves the solicitation of bids in order to repair the streets, curbs and sidewalks in accordance with the Village Engineer's and Council's recommendations.

SECTION II. That the Village Engineer is hereby authorized to prepare the bid specifications and the Clerk is authorized to advertise for said bids.

SECTION III. That such advertising shall be done in a newspaper of general circulation.

SECTION IV. That the Clerk be and is hereby authorized to pay for said advertising and to charge the same to legal advertising, Account No. 101.707.52409.

SECTION V. That this Resolution is an emergency measure necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the Village. The reason for the emergency is to obtain bids earlier to obtain better rates and to insure that the work gets completed during favorable weather.


