RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE NAMING OF THE HIAWATHA / REMBOLD MEDIAN TO THE "INTERURBAN TROLLEY LINE PARK"

WHEREAS, the Health and Recreation Committee is recommending that the Hiawatha / Rembold Median in the Village of Mariemont be named for its historic significance as the site is currently listed in Mariemont Code of Ordinances 151.075(F)(24)(d) as a landmark park; and

WHEREAS, Council for the Village of Mariemont believes that it would preserve the historic significance of said Hiawatha / Rembold Median by the naming the Median the "Interurban Tolley Line Park"; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Village Solicitor that the naming of said landmark park will have no adverse impact on future potential improvements and/or the funding to the landmark park being named the Interurban Trolley Line Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MARIEMONT, HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO, TWO THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

SECTION I. That the Hiawatha / Rembold Median in the Village of Mariemont shall be named the Interurban Tolley Line Park.

SECTION II. That the naming of this landmark park shall have no adverse impact on future potential improvements and/or funding to the space.

SECTION III. That this Resolution shall go into effect at the earliest date allowed by law.
