RESOLUTION NO. R-4-20

TO ASSEMBLE A SWIM POOL TASK FORCE TO HELP INCREASE REVENUE AND/OR <sup>DECREASE</sup> ~~DECREASE~~ EXPENSES OF THE MARIEMONT SWIMMING POOL AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Mariemont has been suffering a deficit between the Swim Pool revenues and expenses, and

WHEREAS, Council believes it is in the best interest of the Village of Mariemont to create a Swim Pool Task Force to develop a set of recommendations to present to Council as to how to increase revenue and/or decrease expenses at the Mariemont Swim Pool.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MARIEMONT, HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO, TWO THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

SECTION I. That a Swim Pool Task Force be created for the limited purpose of coming up with ways in which the Village can improve the pools economics and its ongoing viability.

SECTION II. That the Swim Pool Task Force shall consist of seven (7) members, which shall include one representative from the Swim Pool Commission and one representative from the Mariemont Preschool Parents Group. The other five individuals shall have fundraising experience, financial/budgeting skills, and involvement with the Mariemont Swim Team. The Task Force shall also select a chairman who can lead and organize a team and deliver tangible actionable results.

SECTION III. That this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall go into immediate effect. The reason for said emergency is the need to organize the team and come up with ideas to put in effect prior to the start of the 2020 Swim Pool season.


