**RESOLUTION NO. R-15-22**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO EXECUTE AND FILE APPLICATION WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN CONNECTION WITH THE DOGWOOD PARK PROJECT AND THE MUNICIPAL SWIM POOL; AND TO DECLARE EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio through the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, administers financial assistance for public recreation purposes, through the State of Ohio NatureWorks grant program and;

WHEREAS, the Village of Mariemont desires financial assistance under the NatureWorks Grant Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Council of the Village of Mariemont, State of Ohio, two-thirds of the members duly elected thereto concurring:

SECTION I. That the Village of Mariemont approves filing this application for financial assistance in connection with the Dogwood Park Project and the Municipal Swim Pool .

SECTION II. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file an application with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and to provide all information and documentation required to become eligible for possible funding assistance. That the Village of Mariemont does agree to obligate the funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and become eligible for reimbursement under the terms of the NatureWorks Grant Program.

SECTION III. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and should go into immediate effect upon passage. The reason for the said emergency is to assure the application is submitted by the grant application deadline.
