TO APPOINT DON KEYES TO THE NEW POSITION OF BUILDING DEPARTMENT ADMISISTRATOR FOR CALENDAR YEARS 2015 AND 2016 – TO FULFILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF BUILDING COMMISSIONER KIRK HODULIK; TO SET COMPENSATION; AND TO DECLARE EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Mayor has chosen to appoint Don Keyes as the Building Department Administrator for calendar years 2015 and 2016 to fulfill the unexpired term of Building Commissioner Kirk Hodulik; and

WHEREAS, Council also feels that Don Keyes is well qualified to fulfill the duties of the position for which he has been hired.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MARIEMONT, STATE OF OHIO, TWO THIRD OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

SECTION I. That Council confirms the appointment of Don Keyes as the Building Department Administrator for the calendar years 2015 and 2016. The remuneration for Mr. Keyes shall be an annual salary of \$32,105.00 being payable in equal monthly payments.

SECTION II. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and it shall go into immediate effect. The reason for the emergency is to allow for compensation to be paid in September on a timely basis.
