## RESOLUTION FOR THE PROSTATE CANCER COMMUNITY TO HELP RAISE AWARENESS FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER

WHEREAS, 1 in 7 men will get prostate cancer sometime in his lifetime; and

WHEREAS, Veterans are 1.5 times more likely to get prostate cancer; and

WHEREAS, prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed form of cancer and the second leading cause of cancer related deaths among men; and

WHEREAS this year approximately 180,890 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the Unites States alone every year - that's one man every 2.9 minutes and roughly 26,120 die this year from the disease - which is one every 20 minutes; and

WHEREAS, African American men are at the highest risk for the disease with a rate of 1 in 4 men. African American men are 2.5 times likely to die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, Education regarding prostate cancer and early detection strategies is critical to saving lives and preserving and protecting our families.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MARIEMONT, A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS DULY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

SECTION I. Where all men are at risk for prostate cancer and the Village Council encourages the citizens of the Village of Mariemont, Ohio to increase their awareness of the importance of prostate cancer screenings.
