MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL VILLAGE OF MARIEMONT, OHIO COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING HELD IN COUNCIL CHAMBER FEBRUARY 27, 2012

Vice-Mayor Black called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. The following Council members were present: Mr. Black, Mr. Miller, Mr. Scheeser, Ms. McCarthy and Mr. Wolter.

Mayor Policastro said another tribute in the works for General Short is he is working on putting a permanent light on the flag so it can be flown at all times. It will also help his son, Charles, so he will not have to take the flag down every night and put it up the nest morning.

Mrs. Barb Anderson asked if anything was being done to replace torn flags. Mayor Policastro said we ordered a bunch of flags and encouraged residents to let the office know if one needs to be replaced.

Council agreed to remove the list item from the agenda.
