Ms. Valerie Garber, 6812 Miami Bluff Drive, was granted permission to address Council. At the last Council meeting the subject of possible dirt bikes in Whiskey Creek was brought up. She has lived in the Village her whole life and has exited on Pleasant Street. She is concerned because there are so many cars there now and she worries that with outside people coming into the Village the area will become even more congested.

Ms. Palazzolo moved, seconded by Ms. Schwartz to pay the bills as approved by the Mayor, Fiscal Officer and Chairman of the Finance Committee. Mr. Brown asked about the repair cost to the fire truck. He asked if there is another company that the work could have been put to a bid. Chief Hines said we knew there was a problem with a particular part in the pumper. Once they started to dig further they found other parts that were cracked. He knows this company has worked on our equipment for years. We did not know the extent of the needed work until they started on it. On roll call; six ayes, no nays.

Mr. Wolter gave a verbal update on the changes at Lunken Airport. The bottom line is he does not believe that the proposed changes will have an effect on the Village of Mariemont. He gave a brief presentation of the new runway configurations. There may be more operators of larger airplanes coming to the airport because of the ability to add additional hanger space. He anticipates that the noise level will remain the same. He will prepare a formal written report for Council.
